











The professional who Doctor treats you at the hospital when you are sick Hospital The building you go to when you are feeling HOSPITAL sick or injured

Forming "are" questions

Auxiliary verb + Subject + Main verb

Auxiliary verb	Subject	Main verb	
Are	you	feeling (to feel)	sick today?
Are	you	showing (to show)	symptoms?
Are	you	taking (to take)	your medicine?

Example:

you/?/body aches/are/having → are you having body aches?

Forming "are" questions

- you/feeling/?/sick today/are
- are/showing/you/?/symptoms
- taking/are/your medicine/you/?
- fever/?/you/a/do/have
- you/sore throat/have/?/a/do
- symptoms/are/what/your/?
- are/why/here/?/you

Conversations with your Doctor

Example:

Doctor: What are your symptoms today?

Patient: I have a cough and fever.

Doctor: How long have you had a cough? Patient: I have had a cough for 2 days.

Doctor: Are you showing symptoms?

Patient: Yes, I have had a sore throat for 3 days.

Doctor: Are you feeling sick?

Patient: Yes, I have been feeling sick for a week.
