Phrasal Verbs

verb + adverb or verb + preposition

or

verb + preposition

Phrasal Verbs

	verb	(+ adverb or verb) <i>sometimes there is no adverb/2nd verb</i>	+ preposition
Definition	an action word	adverb: describes a verb or adjective	shows relationship between 2 things
Examples	to walk, to learn, to eat	slowly, carefully, extremely	in, on, at, above, after
Phrasal verb examples	to get	along	with
	to make		up
	to figure		out

Get Away

Definition: To escape from something

verb + adverb or verb + preposition

get + away + from/to

Examples:

- a. A lot of people move into tiny homes or vans to **get away** from the busy life in the cities.
- b. I want to **get away** from this noisy neighborhood.



Go By

Definition: To pass someone or something quickly.

verb + preposition

go + by

Examples:

- a. When traveling on Route 66, you are able to **go by** many different places.
- b. I go by 3 starbucks on my way to work.



Hang Around

Definition: To spend time in a place or an area.

verb + preposition

hang + around

Examples:

- a. They **hung around** the beach for a few days before continuing their road trip to the mountains.
- b. They **hung around** the beach for a few days before they continued their road trip to the mountains.



Cut Down

Definition: To do less of something or to use something in smaller amounts.

verb + preposition
cut + down

Examples:

- a. Living in alternative housing allows you to **cut down** on your expenses.
- b. Create your own!
